Reasons to keep your information current include:

- It streamlines outage reporting when we have the correct phone number linked to your service address.
- For planned outages, you can receive advance notice if your information is up to date.
- We may need to contact you for more information regarding an outage or service issue.
- Correct contact information allows easier online accessibility.
- Receive reminders if your bill is overdue and subject to disconnection.
- Ensure your patronage capital accrues to the right person and that checks are mailed to the correct address when they are retired.

GIVE THE GIFT OF SOLAR

Here's a gift for the person who has everything. This season, you can shop at Blue Grass Energy and give the gift of renewable energy. Blue Grass Energy is offering solar panel licenses through our Cooperative Solar program.

NO ASSEMBLY REQUIRED

For a one-time payment of \$460 per panel, your gift recipient gets a 25-year license to one of the panels at our 60-acre solar farm near I-64 in Winchester. Each month, license holders will receive credit on their bill for their proportional share of the energy generated by the solar farm.

You can give Cooperative Solar to any Blue Grass Energy member on your holiday gift list regardless of whether they rent or own their home. You can also purchase a solar panel license for friends and family who are members of participating Kentucky's Touchstone Energy Cooperatives.

Moving is no problem with Cooperative Solar. The solar license is honored by participating Kentucky's Touchstone Energy Cooperatives. Or, if your gift recipient moves outside of the service area, the remainder of the license can be assigned to another co-op member, such as a family member, friend, church or school.
