Unlock comfort and savings

onsider adding home weatherization to your summer to-do list. We typically think about weatherizing our homes during winter months when we're standing next to a chilly window or a drafty exterior door. But weatherizing your home provides comfort and energy savings year-round, especially during summer months when your air conditioner is working overtime.

According to energystar.gov, a home with insufficient insulation and air leaks wastes more than 20% of the energy used to heat or cool the home—that's essentially throwing money out the door. Fortunately, most weatherization projects are easy to DIY and can be completed in a day.

The simplest and most cost-effective weatherization strategies include air sealing around windows and exterior doors.

If you have older windows, odds are you have air escaping through tiny cracks and gaps around the frame. Do a quick visual inspection. If you can see any daylight around the frame or the windows rattle easily, you likely have air leaks. Also check for any small cracks around the frame that may not be visible with sunlight.

If you suspect you have leaky windows and plan to apply new caulk, be sure to remove the old caulk and clean the area well before application. Caulking materials vary in strength





and properties, but you'll likely need a half-cartridge per window.

Silicone caulk is a popular choice and can also be used to seal joints between bathroom and kitchen fixtures. If you have any leftover caulk, use it to seal those areas.

INSTALL WEATHER STRIPPING

Another effective but simple weatherization project is installing weather stripping around exterior doors. The most common types of weather stripping options are V-channel, felt and foam tape. To choose the best type for your home, consider temperature fluctuations and weather exposure. Most homeowners opt for felt or foam tape; both options are easy to install, but will need to be replaced every couple years, depending on wear and tear. Weather stripping should be installed around the top and sides of the door.

If you see daylight around the bottom of an exterior door, consider installing a door sweep in addition to weather stripping. Door sweeps are available in aluminum, plastic, vinyl and felt options.

Weather stripping can also be installed around windows, typically to the sides of a double hung or sliding window, or around the window sash.

If you're unsure how to install weather stripping or apply caulk, check out trusted websites like energy.gov for step-bystep instructions and video tutorials.

Another way to improve comfort in your home is adding insulation. While this is a more costly project and requires a professional's help, it's an effective way to decrease heat flow,

STAY ALERT Around water and electricity

During the spring and summer, farmers often must use irrigation equipment to supplement rainfall, but water and electricity don't mix. It's essential to use safe work practices:

- **Properly select and install equipment.** The system should be wired to the standards of the National Electrical Code: It must have disconnect switches; it must use equipment and enclosures suitable for conditions; it must protect wires from physical damage or use jacketed irrigation cable; and it must have circuit and equipment grounding.
- **Do routine maintenance checks.** Proactively look for faulty equipment and proper wiring installation.
- Use safe work practices. Turn off the power before working on an irrigation system. Be aware of
 overhead power lines when working with irrigation pipes, when standing on systems and when
 spraying water near power lines. Avoid wearing loose clothing and tie back long hair when near
 rotating equipment.

Levelized billing

By signing up for levelized billing, you can prevent drastic changes in the amount of your bill. Levelized billing makes it easier because you receive a bill of approximately the same amount each month.

A levelized bill averages the previous 12 monthly bills along with the current month's usage. Because it is a "rolling average," the need to annually settle up balances is eliminated. Reconciliation of your account will be necessary only if you move or decide to stop participating in the program.

To enroll, you must have been at your current address for at least one year and your account must have a zero balance.
